




















#### SPIRIT WEEK EXCITEMENT AT HOKE HIGH

### WEST FORSYTH AJROTC DEFEATS HOKE COUNTY JROTC

West Forsyth AJROTC defeated Hoke County AJROTC 970.9 to 792.6 in the 2024 National Air Rifle New Shooter League. West Forsyth AJROTC was led by Christian Ortiz Vargas who shot a 259.1. The remaining contributing members were Gabriela Gonzalez, Alexander Oxendine, and Janluca Chinchilla. They are from Clemmons, NC, and are coached by MAJ Richard Sugg.

Overall West Forsyth AJROTC is ranked twelfth. They have a 1 - 0 record. Hoke County AJROTC was led by Miguel Sanchez Jimenez who shot a 237.9. The remaining contributing members were Jalyn Fernandez, Alexander Robinson, and Tyler Stanley. Hoke County AJROTC is from Raeford, NC, and is coached by Harold Thacker. Overall Hoke County AJROTC is ranked thirty-eighth. They have a 0 - 1 record. This coming week West Forsyth AJROTC has a bye week. While Hoke County AJROTC will compete against U. S. Grant MCJROTC from Oklahoma City, OK. U. S. Grant MCJROTC currently has a 0 - 1 record.

These two teams are competing in the National Air Rifle "New Shooter" League. Sponsored by Scopos, the league is a national team league exclusive to athletes in their first year of competition. Teams are from high schools and junior rifle clubs throughout the United States. Over 10 weeks each team competes in 8 games. Each week, each team is paired with another team with a near equal skill level. In each game the teams compete in what is known as a Three-Position Air Rifle match. The match is modeled after Olympic Rifle competitions but adapted to high school age athletes. Each athlete will shoots 10 shots in three different shooting positions, kneeling, prone, and standing. Each shot is worth a maximum of 10.9 points. The sum of points scored in the 30 shots is the athlete's total. The team score is comprised of the best four athletes from each team.

### JHCHS RAIDER TEAM MEET WITH OTHERS AT NORTH BRUNSWICK HIGH SCHOOL

Sgt. Ford, Instructor of the HCHS JROTC Raiders meets with other schools at North Brunswick HS, on Feb 24, 2024. This program is important to not just its members but their parents as well. These students pride themselves on always being motivated and intent on completing their missions. The Raider team can allow up to 35 JROTC cadets to join, who have shown their ability to keep up with their other class and meet the PT(Physical Training) standard. For females, their mile time must be 9 minutes or below, 30 push-ups and above, and 40 sit-ups and above, while for the males their mile time must be 7:30 minutes or below, 43 pushups and above, and 45 sit-ups and above. Being and staying motivated and being physically fit are two main traits needed to be a part of a raider team. Raider meets can vary around seven each year but can be more or less. A common challenge among these raiders is endurance, being able to mentally push through this challenge is what it's all about in Raiders.
