COSMOTOLOGY READY FOR BUSINESS






Staff Spotlight

Denise Cummings is the Animal Science teacher at Hoke High School. She was inspired to teach so she could help provide theyounger generation with basic "soft skills" when caring for animals. Cumming's curriculum provides many opportunities for knowledge; her curriculum teaches the student about the different animal bodies and digestive systems. The curriculum also includes some grooming techniques- like how to properly trim animals' nails. Cummings stated that she has about "40 animals, counting the chickens". The variety of animals in the classroom gives all students significant opportunities to learn how to work with multiple species of animals.


