
UNC AIRCARE GIVES STUDENTS HANDS-ON EXPERIENCE

ALBINO CHOSEN FOR ALL-CAROLINA SELECT CHOIR









BUILDING KNOWLEDGE WITH BRAIN HATS






FUTURE TEACHERS LEAD PEERS






















LETTER WRITING:

MILITARY + VETERAN

Thank you for volunteering with Operation Gratitude to write letter of gratitude for Military and Veterans.

Please follow these guidelines when writing letters:

• Write Letters for:

Deployed Troops, Recruit Graduates + Veterans

Address letters to the following:

"Dear Service Member", "Dear Hero", "Dear Veteran" etc.

- Express your thanks for their selfless service to our country.
- Keep messages positive:

Suggested topics include: expressing gratitude for their service, sharing hopeful messages, well wishes, and positive thoughts.

Prayers are welcome, however please avoid excessive religious comments, scripture and religious images share about yourself, family, hobbies, work, school, pets, travel, interests, etc.

Abstain from writing about violence, killing, injury, death and dying, etc.

Avoid all mention of politics

- Refrain from including contact or distinguishing information for anyone under the age of 18: This includes last name, home or email address, phone numbers, school information, and social media usernames.
- If you are over 18, you may include your contact information so letter writing recipients can reply:

 Due to time and location limitations, they might not reply; please do not be disappointed
- Can't find the words?
 - Consider drawing or painting a picture instead. Please add a note to kids' drawings with their age. Refrain from using glitter or confetti please!
- Please leave letters out of individual envelopes:

All letters will go through a screening process and envelopes slow that down significantly.
